

May 13, 2015

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met on May 13, 2015 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Bob Gladfelter and Charlie VanScoyoc. Others present were: April Rehbein, Attorney John Herrold, Jeff Shue, Carolyn & Steve Bupp, Brian Kaltreider and John Amspacher.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Bob made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Lamar. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The sealed bids for various types of crushed stone were opened and read as follows:

York Building bid:

200 tons AS anti-skid @\$12.45 per ton for a total of \$2,490.00  
200 tons AASHTO #8 @ \$11.75 per ton for a total of \$2,350.00  
4,000 tons PA-2A subbase @ \$8.25 per ton for a total of \$33,000.00  
1500 tons AASHTO #57 @ \$11.75 per ton for a total of \$17,625.00  
500 tons AASHTO #1 @ \$11.75 per ton for a total of \$5,875.00  
200 tons Rock Lining R-4 @ \$16.00 per ton for a total of \$3,200.00  
4500 tons DSA stone @ \$13.90 per ton for a total of \$62,550.00

200 tons R-8 Rip Rap @ \$21.00 per ton for a total of \$4,200.00

Bob commented that the DSA from York Building is not the quality that is required by the Dirt and Gravel Road program for the grant.

Bob made a motion to award the contract for DSA to Vulcan and the contract for the remainder of the stones to York Building. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The sealed bids for bituminous seal coat and rubberized joint seal were opened and read as follows:

Hammaker East bid:

37,332 sq. yd. bituminous seal coat @ \$1.07 per unit for a total of \$39,945.24  
10,000 lbs. rubberized joint seal @ \$1.68 per unit for a total of \$16,800.00

Martin Paving bid:

37,332 sq. yd. bituminous seal coat @ \$1.27 per unit for a total of \$47,411.64  
10,000 lbs. rubberized joint seal @ \$1.50 per unit for a total of \$15,000.00

Stewart & Tate bid:

37,332 sq. yd. bituminous seal coat @ \$1.179 per unit for a total of \$44,014.43  
10,000 lbs. rubberized joint seal @ \$2.01 per unit for a total of \$20,100.00

Bob made a motion to award the contract to Hammaker East. Lamar seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Brian asked the Board to look into the article in the Township News magazine about posting & bonding of roads.

Carolyn Bupp would like to work out the lawsuit. Lamar told Carolyn the Board will be meeting in executive session following tonight's meeting.

A request was received from Team Ag for a 90 day extension for both the Hillandale land development plan and James Bailey land development plan. Bob made a motion to accept the extensions for Hillandale & James Bailey. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The Board reviewed the contract for the advertisement banners for the Township Park. Attorney Herrold will make the corrections that are needed.

Bob asked Jeff Shue if James Bailey and Hillandale need to pass a water study. Jeff stated that study is needed and will need to show the usage of water for that property and the impact it will have on surrounding properties.

The Board went into executive session at 8:30 P.M.

The executive session closed at 9:25 P.M.

Three quotes were received for 7,000 gals of calcium chloride. Recon Construction quoted \$1.19 per gallon. Environmental Energy Solutions quoted \$137.9 per gallon. Calcium Chloride Sales, Inc. quoted \$1.50 per gallon.

Bob made a motion to accept the quote of Recon Construction. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The bills were presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The meeting adjourned at 9:35.
