

June 4, 2015

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met on June 4, 2015 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Bob Gladfelter and Charlie VanScoyoc. Others present were: April Rehbein, Doug Young, Linda Smith Steve & Carolyn Bupp, John Rohrbaugh and Steve Nafe.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Lamar announced that the Board met with Attorney Malone in executive session on May 14, 2015 regarding a proposed ordinance.

Bob made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Lamar. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Linda Smith was before the Board concerning her property on Snyder Mill Road. She has her property listed for sale and lost a buyer due to the proposed chicken houses and feed mill. She would like the Board to consider the residents before they make a decision on this proposal.

Carolyn had some questions about the proposed changes to the zoning ordinance. The Board will need to review these questions with Attorney Malone.

Doug Young from the Glen Rock Borough Council presented the plan for the Glen Rock Park. The Borough is applying for a DCED grant and would like a letter of support from the Township. The Supervisors will send a letter of support and have also offered to help with the demolition of the existing playground.

The York County Planning Commission comments for George Williams plan have been received. Bob made a motion to approve and sign the plan, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Spoutwood farms have forwarded their insurance certificate and attendance records for the Fairy Festival that was held in May.

Lamar made a motion to appoint Rick Sechrist to another 4 year term on the Planning Commission. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The one year extension contract for Penn Waste was presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to accept and sign the extension. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Denise Wagner would like to get a permit for use of fireworks for agricultural purposes. The Board will discuss this with Attorney Herrold at the next meeting.

A letter was presented to the Board with the conditions that must be met by D & D Land Management before their plan can be approved. Bob made a motion to have Lamar sign the letter, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Bob presented proposals from the Middle Department and Code Administrators for the Township zoning officer and inspector. Middle Department would only be interested in doing the inspections. The Board will request a cost sheet for permits and copy a of the permit application.

The Board discussed the road hog machine that was demonstrated on Ridge Road. Bob feels that purchasing the machine would save the Township money on roadwork. The Board will contact Springfield Township to see roads that were done in their Township with this machine.

The bills were presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.
