

February 8, 2017

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met on February 8, 2017 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Bob Gladfelter and Charlie Van Scoyoc. Others present were: Ed Ward, Troy Snyder, Jason Gross, Attorney Herrold, April & Dave Rehbein, Brian Kaltreider, Steve & Carolyn Bupp and Chuck Johnston.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

There were no public comments.

The bids for refuse were opened and read as follows:

Penn Waste

Basic \$22.78 per quarter

Tag a bag \$4.25 per bag

Recycling with tag a bag program \$9.00 per quarter

Dumpster at the Township building \$200.00 each time it is picked up.

Republic:

Basic \$23.02 per quarter

Tag a bag \$4.15 per bag

Recycling with tag a bag program \$5.00 per quarter

Dumpster at the Township building \$50.00 each time it is picked up.

Bob made a motion to award the bid to Penn Waste. Charlie seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Troy Snyder of the Jefferson Fire Company was present to give the yearly report.

Carolyn Bupp stated that on the January 11, 2017 minutes it states that she reported that Jason Gross didn't have a permit for his signs. Carolyn said she didn't report that and would like the minutes amended. Carolyn also stated that she would like to see tougher kennel ordinances.

Resolution #17-2 Procedures for investigating complaints was presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to adopt resolution 17-2, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Attorney Herrold reported that Marlette Thomas has combined three properties into one. The deed has not been recorded yet but a copy will be sent to the Township.

A letter was sent to Steven & Carolyn Bupp and Samuel Fisher regarding the subdivision plan for the two properties.

The hearing for the Hillandale appeal is scheduled for March 7, 2017 at 11:00 A.M.

The bills were presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charlie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.
