

April 11, 1990

The Board of Supervisors of Codorus Township met in regular session on April 11, 1990 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Charles Wehrly and Leroy Thoman. Others present were: Mahlon Stambaugh, Harry Brose and James Kunkel.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the pledge to the Flag.

The minutes of the April 5 meeting were approved as written.

Bids for road materials were opened as advertised, and publicly read.

Two bids were received for E-3 Emulsion.

The first bid proposal opened was from William S. Hammaker, Inc. of Harrisburg, PA. with a bid price as follows:

70,000 gals. E-3 Emulsion @ \$.574 per gallon for a total of \$40,180.00

The second bid was by Daniel B. Krieg, Inc. of Harrisburg with a bid price of:

70,000 gals. E-3 Emulsion @ \$.58 per gallon for a total of \$40,600.00

The analysis of both bids were reviewed. Bid bonds were included with both bids.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to accept the bid from Daniel B. Krieg, Inc. due to location and penetration. Charles Wehrly seconded this motion. This motion passed.

Two bids were received for FB1 Binder and FB1 Wearing in place.

Wm. S. Hammaker, Inc. of Harrisburg bid as follows:

1,300 Tons FB1 Wearing in place @ 20.80 per ton for a total of 27,040.00

Roadite, Division of Stewart & March, Inc., York, PA bid as follows:

Charles Wehrly made a motion to award the bid to Roadite, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion passed.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to award the stone bid to York Building Products, Inc. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. This motion passed.

Mahlon Stambaugh gave the report of sewage permits issued during the past month.

The Board of Supervisors and Mr. Stambaugh discussed the letter from Lawrence W. and Sharen Vance. Mr. & Mrs. Vance are requesting a hearing and an appeal for Mr. Stambaugh's refusal to issue a sewage permit for the former Blomeier lot along Shaffer's Church Road.

Mr. Stambaugh stated he had reasons to deny the permit without another percolation test being done. When the first test was done for the Blomeier lot in 1986, the first site failed; a second site passed for a shallow placement system.

When a party, other than Mr. Vance, met him at the lot in question on March 26, 1990, the party did not know the exact site where the previous test had been performed. The land had been farmed over, so the site was not readily visible.

A hearing for this request of Mr. & Mrs. Vance will be held at 7:30 P.M., Wednesday, April 18 in the township office. The York office of D.E.R. will be notified of this hearing.

Randy Curry of Brillhart Insurance was present with a quote on package insurance for the Township. The quote is from Selective Insurance. The Board will make a decision later on which Insurance Company to use.

Chairman Glatfelter reported that he had called Dale Hersh, Jefferson Borough, to tell him that Codorus Township is not interested in purchasing police protection from the Borough at this time. There was not enough interest from Township residents to have local police protection.

The bills were presented to the Board.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 P.M. on motion of Lamar Glatfelter and second by Leroy Thoman.
