

June 7, 1990

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on June 7, 1990 at 7:30 P.M. in the township office. Board members present were: Leroy Thoman, Charles Wehrly and Leroy Thoman. Others present were: Bob Shaffer of C.S. Davidson, Inc., Randy Sterner and Irvin Rappoldt.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the Flag.

The minutes were approved as read.

The May treasurer's report was presented to the Board members.

Bob Shaffer of C.S. Davidson, Inc. was present to go over the Storm Water Management Plan for the South Branch Codorus Creek Watershed - Act 167. Mr. Shaffer left 2 copies of the Plan with the Township, along with two model ordinances. He asked that the Solicitor review this plan and model ordinance since all municipalities in this watershed will need to comply by adopting the ordinance. York County Planning Commission will be holding public hearings regarding this Storm Water Management Plan and the Plan will have to be approved by the Pa. Department of Environmental Resources. The State will pay 75% of the cost to adopt this ordinance.

Randy Sterner reported that he has arranged for a radiological training session to be held here at the Township building June 23 and June 24. The sessions will run from 8 A.M. to 2 P.M. Randy will be in contact with the local fire companies to recruit persons interested in this training.

The Marshal Graves private driveway has been completed and a letter from C.S. Davidson, Inc. has been received, stating the driveway meets the plan specifications.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to release the \$17,600. plus interest escrow deposit that Marshall Graves deposited with the Gettysburg National Bank. Seconded by Leroy Thoman. This motion passed. Mr. Graves will receive the interest earned on this deposit.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the report of building permits issued during the month of May. Mr. Rappoldt asked if he should now pursue the swimming pool violators, since it has been almost three months since letters were sent to all pool owners, asking that they comply with the Zoning Ordinance. The Board gave Mr. Rappoldt the authority to pursue this matter. Irvin will also make a list of residents who are in violation of the junked car ordinance.

The bills were presented to the Board. Leroy Thoman made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 10:50 P.M. on motion of Lamar Glatfelter and second by Leroy Thoman.
