

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on September 6, 1990 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Charles Wehrly and Leroy Thoman. Others present were James Bailey & John Ridinger, a representative of York Waste Disposal.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the pledge to the Flag.

The minutes were approved as written.

John Ridinger, a recycling director with York Waste Disposal had been asked to attend the meeting to answer questions the Board has regarding recycling.

Mr. Ridinger outlined three options that are possible for recycling in the Township.

1. A container that would be open around the clock.
2. A container that would be open certain days.
3. A trailer that would be brought in for a certain day

Mr. Ridinger gave the advantages and disadvantages of each type and an approximate cost of each service. A modified container would cost approximately \$200.00 per month plus \$150.00 to remove it, plus a processing fee of \$30.00 per ton. The processing would be done at their recycling center in York. A trailer would cost approximately \$100.00 per day to be brought out and returned plus the processing fee. The cost would entail (1) rental of the equipment (2) transportation (3) cost of processing and the cost to the Township for an employee to be present to monitor what is put in the container or trailer in order that non-recyclable items be kept out.

Items that could be recycled are newspapers, clear and colored glass, aluminum and steel cans. Plastics could be recycled, but are harder for the hauler to get rid of.

If the Township would want to go with curbside pickup of recyclable items, the Township would need to have an annual contract with a hauler with recycling made a part of the contract.

Since there are three or more haulers now servicing the Township, curbside recycling could not be done at the present time.

The Board will consider the different options outlined by Mr. Ridinger before making any decisions to start any type of recycling.

In the absence of the tax collector, Goldie Day presented the report of taxes collected during August. The tax collector asked that small refunds be made to three property owners.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to refund the following real estate tax refunds, \$2.90 to James & Jodie Bury, \$3.13 to Floyd and Hazel Mummert and \$2.66 to Paul Dehoff. Charles Wehrly seconded this motion. This motion carried.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to adopt Resolution #90-5, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This resolution regards an impact fee law which is now being considered for passage by the State. The Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors wants changes made to the law as now proposed.

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When the Township adopted Shaffer's Church Road in the Turnback Program, the State was making repairs to the bridge at the lower end of this road. The was not included in the turnback contract. The State now wishes to turn the bridge back to the Township.

Leroy Thoman made amotion to adopt Resolution #90-6 to adopt the bridge on Shffer's Church Road, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed. This bridge is know presently as SR 3108 and is .003 miles in length.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to place an order for salt with Cargill Salt at \$ 39.62 per ton delivered , seconded by Leroy Thoman., This motion passed.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Leroy Thoman. This motion passed.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to have the October road inspection at 7:30 A.M., Friday, October 26, 1990, seconded by Charles Wehrly.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M. on motion by Leroy Thoman and second by Charles Wehrly.
