

October 4, 1990

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on October 4, 1990 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Leroy Thoman and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: John Rutkowski, Judith Barrett and William McGrew.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the pledge to the Flag.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

John Rutkowski owns 28½ acres along Rockville Road. He proposes to keep the wooded section and sell the balance of the property. He is not sure how many acres are in the wooded section. The Board told him that a site inspection by the Planning Commission members and supervisors will be set up before a decision is made. He will be advised of the date and time of the inspection.

Judith Barrett presented the final plan of the property she is purchasing from Eloise Schwartz King. Ms. Barrett proposes to sell 21.893 acres to William McGrew as an add on to his farm. This plan will be submitted to the York County Planning Commission before any decision is made. She was told to bring the plan to the October 25th Planning Commission meeting.

Supervisor Wehrly reported that he had been approached by Jack Rhine who owns property along the private road that leads off Smoketown Road. Mr. Rhine wanted to know about subdivision possibilities. Since this property is along a private road where several other properties are, Mr. Rhine should bring this before the Township Planning Commission.

The Secretary read a letter from Seven Valleys Postmaster, Kay Thomas. One of the rural mail carriers from Seven Valleys was involved in an accident at the intersection of Rice Road and Shaffer's Church Road. Ms. Thomas is requesting that the weeds be cut and the gravel removed from the road at this intersection plus other suggestions. Supervisor Wehrly will check this site and report his findings to the Secretary so a letter can be sent to Ms. Thomas.

Lamar Glatfelter stated he had been asked by the Glen Rock American Legion Baseball team for a donation from the Township. This request will be considered when the 1991 budget is adopted.

The bills were presented to the Board. Leroy Thoman made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M. on motion of Charles Wehrly and second by Leroy Thoman.
