

January 3, 1991

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Thursday, January 3, 1991 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Charles Wehrly and Leroy Thoman. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Jane LoPiccolo and Mahlon Stambaugh.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag.

The minutes were approved as written.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to adopt Ordinance 91-1 as advertised, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion passed unanimously. This ordinance sets the speed limit for Catholic Valley Road at 30 miles per hour.

Jane LoPiccolo was present with the proposed subdivision plan of their property. She wanted to make sure she had the required changes correct before having the plan revised. She was told by the Board that the following would be required:

- (1) The noxious odor statement must be added to the plan
- (2) A notation on the plan that the remaining building rights would go with Lot #1
- (3) The proposed driveway would have a 25 ft. right-of-way with a stoned 16 ft. mud free drive
- (4) Two pipes (either plastic or galvanized) would need to be installed as discussed with the Supervisors at the December 27 site inspection.

She was told that the driveway must be in before a building permit is issued.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to authorize the Chairman to sign the requisition for payment by C.S. Davidson, Inc. for engineering work on the Sewer Feasibility Study at Glenville. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. Motion passed. All costs for this study are being paid for by a Community Block Grant.

Solicitor Herrold reported on the correspondence he has received from the Southern York County School District and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regarding the water run-off problem at the new construction site at Friendship Elementary School. He advised the Board to monitor this site and call PennDot if a problem is seen with run-off onto S.R. 216.

Mahlon Stambaugh reported that Jacob Miller has promised to have the sewage problem at his Sinsheim property corrected within a week.

The bills were presented to the Board. Leroy Thoman made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 9:10P.M. on motion by Charles Wehrly and second by Leroy Thoman.
