

February 7, 1991

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on February 7, 1991 at 7:30 P.M. in the township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Leroy Thoman and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: James Bailey, Ruth Baer and Jane LoPiccolo.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

Jane LoPiccolo was present with the subdivision plan of their farm along Rt. 616 and Snyder Road. She told the Board that the driveway would be put in to the Board's specifications before the lot is sold. They have a contract with Lawrence Wirtz who will be doing the road work as soon as weather permits.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to approve the plan with the stipulation that the driveway is put in and D.E.R. approval of the septic system has been received before a building permit is issued. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. Motion passed. Mrs. LoPiccolo was asked to present the plan to the Township Planning Commission for signing after the above items have been completed.

Ruth Baer gave the report of taxes collected for January. She also asked to be exonerated for 154 1990 per capita taxes. These exonerations are for students, low income persons, deceased and persons that have moved.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to exonerate Ruth Baer from the collection of 154 per capita taxes for the year 1990, seconded by Leroy Thoman. This motion passed.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to issue junk yard renewal licenses for 1991 to Clair Amspacher and Rufus Snyder. Charles Wehrly seconded this motion. This motion passed.

Charles Wehrly made a motion that the Chairman sign the extension for the Block Grant for stream improvements to December 31, 1991, seconded by Leroy Thoman. This motion passed. This extension will give the engineer time to check with the Western Maryland Railroad regarding work needed to be done by the railroad.

Leroy Thoman made a motion to pay Charles Wehrly his regular pay for three days which Mr. Wehrly attended a Commercial Drivers License workshop held by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. The motion passed.

Chairman Glatfelter asked the secretary to apply to PennDot for a parade permit for the York County Firemen's Convention to be held August 27 in Jefferson. State Routes 516 and Sinsheim Road will be closed for approximately 1½ hours for the parade.

The correspondence was read from Robert Morris and the York County Waste and Refuse Authority.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Leroy Thoman. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00P.M. on motion of Charles Wehrly and second by Leroy Thoman.
