

February 6, 1992

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on February 6, 1992 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Mr. & Mrs. Ted Fabie, R.C. Williams, Randy Sterner, Steven Bowers, Frederick Tome, David Schnell, Dennis Arnold, Philip Wagner, Rick Sechrist, Tom Moore and Irvin Rappoldt.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board members.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the Zoning Officer report for the month of January.

Mr. Rappoldt reported that a lot of tires had been dumped on the Stoner property along Bonnair Road. He wanted to know if he should notify the Stoners to remove the tires. It is not known who dumped the tires or if the Stoners gave the party permission to dump the tires on their property. The Board told Mr. Rappoldt to try and find out who dumped the tires, then the Board will decide what to do. It was reported that Krug's Auto Salvage along Menges Mill Road will take tires.

Irvin also reported that Michael & Trudi Jones have put up a small barn without a building permit. He is to contact them again regarding this.

Residents living along Tome and Messersmith Roads were present regarding improving Tome Road. Robert Zeltwanger couldn't be at the meeting but submitted a letter outlining his concerns regarding safety should the road be paved. David Schnell was the only resident against paving the road. He likes the road as it is and is concerned about more speeding if the road is paved. R.C. Williams stated that his only concern is that the dust problem along Messersmith Road be eliminated.

Randy Sterner wants the road improved, but only with proper planning and wishes to have some say in the decision since he will lose more frontage than anyone else. Dennis Arnold would like for the traffic to be slowed at his end since he gets so much dust now. Steve Bowers would like to see the road improved with blacktop.

After much discussion, it was decided that the Board of Supervisors will meet with all the Tome Road residents at a time to be set up to go over the plans for improving the road. The Board feels that it will be the same as was previously discussed with the residents.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to appoint Roy D. Gladfelter to another five-year term on the Southern York County School District, seconded by James Bailey. This motion passed.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to issue junk yard renewal licenses to Ed Lucke, Clair Amspacher and Rufus Snyder, seconded by James Bailey. This motion passed.

Philip Wagner and Rick Sechrist discussed proposed changes to the Storm Water Management Plan for the proposed Wagner subdivision. The Supervisors agree to the changes as proposed in accordance with the January 17, 1992 letter from C.S. Davidson. The plan would have to be revised, showing these changes. Charles Wehrly made a motion to approve the revised Storm Water Management Plan of Philip Wagner's subdivision if the plan is revised according to the letter from C.S. Davidson dated January 17, 1992, seconded by James Bailey. This motion passed.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to exonerate the Tax Collector for 22 per capita taxes for 1991, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

James Bailey reported that he had received a complaint from a resident regarding the 100 yard shooting range at the Jefferson Sportsmen's Club. The range is worn down and shots are going through the woods at the Frank Barrick property. The Board will check into this.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by James Bailey. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 10:40 P.M. on motion by James Bailey and second by Charles Wehrly.
