

September 9, 1992

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on September 9, 1992 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Mahlon Stambaugh, Rick Sechrist and Jim Hunt.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

James Bailey made a motion to adopt Ordinance 92-3, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed. This ordinance sets speed limits of 35 miles per hour for Snyder Road and Buffalo Valley Road.

Jim Hunt, a resident living along Roser Road told the Board that there are six homes along the gravel portion of Roser Road from where the paved road ends to Raymond Miller, Sr.'s property. These six residents would like to have the road improved. He said all the residents were in favor. He also wanted to know if the Township would erect low speed limit signs and/or Children at Play signs.

Chairman Glatfelter told Mr. Hunt that the Board has not discussed new roads for 1993, but will be making a decision by December. No promises could be made regarding Roser Road. He was also told to make sure that the residents, including Mr. & Mrs. Jensen, know that the road would be widened to 22 feet of macadam and that the road right-of-way is 33 ft. This right-of-way would require the removal of several trees along the road. Would the Jensens' agree to this?

The Board also would have to find out if speed signs are allowed on gravel roads and would the York County Planning Commission do a traffic study on an unimproved road.

The supervisors reviewed the proposed ordinance prepared by Solicitor Herrold that would permit the storage of explosives in the agricultural zone. The proposal met with the Board's approval and Solicitor Herrold was advised to send a copy to York County Planning Commission for review and to advertise the ordinance for adoption on November 11 with the hearing to be held at 7:30 P.M. prior to adoption.

The bills were presented to the Board. James Bailey made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 P.M. on motion by James Bailey and seconded by Lamar Glatfelter.
