

September 2, 1993

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on September 2, 1993 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Tom Moore, Irvin Rappoldt and Rick Sechrist.

Vice-chairman James Bailey called the meeting to order with the Pledge. The minutes were approved as written.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to approve the Leroy Becker Sewage Facilities Planning Module for submission to D.E.R., James Bailey seconded this motion. The motion carried.

The Board discussed a letter Mrs. Douglas Sullivan received from the York office of Penn.Dot. Mrs. Sullivan had requested bus stop warning signs for the area of S.R. 516 and Shaffer's Church Road. Traffic driving south on Rt. 516 does not have a clear sight distance to see buses stopped at the intersection. Some trees along S.R. 516 block the sight. If Penn Dot does nothing regarding this, the secretary is to contact Representative Mike Waugh to see if he can have something done.

A letter from the New Freedom Borough secretary was read. The Borough would like for the municipalities served by Zoning Officer Irvin Rappoldt to join together in renting a pager for Mr. Rappoldt. With a pager, Mr. Rappoldt would be easier to reach when needed. The cost to each of the four municipalities would be approximately \$50.00 per year.

James Bailey made a motion that the Township participate in the rental of a pager for Irvin Rappoldt, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion carried.

A letter from the Glen Rock Borough Council President, Deborah Dominick was read. Mrs. Dominick wanted to know if the Township would be interested in a joint purchase of major equipment or in renting out equipment already purchased.

The secretary was instructed to send a letter to Mrs. Dominick, telling her that the Township would not be interested in any joint purchases, but would consider loaning the Borough equipment in case of an emergency, after checking with the insurance carrier regarding liability.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the report of building permits issued during the month of August. He also reported that he had sent certified letters to: William Wilson, Jr., William Wilson, Sr. and Lamar Wolfgang regarding junked vehicles, etc. The Board told Mr. Rappoldt to follow through with these violations until the zoning regulations have been complied with.

Mr. Rappoldt was also told that the Township Planning Commission had decided to allow Barry Lucas to continue the operation of his produce stand until the Supervisors change the zoning requirements for this use.

Mr. Rappoldt reported that George Tracey of Bonnair wishes to replace his old mobile home with a new one and wanted to know if it was alright for him to issue a building permit to Mr. Tracey. Irvin has not seen any sign of septic problems at the property and since there would not be any change in the present system, only a replacement of the home, the Board could see no reason why a building permit should not be issued.

The bills were presented to the Board. Charles Wehrly made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

There were no public comments.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M. on motion by James Bailey and second by Charles Wehrly.
