

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on December 8, 1993 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Mahlon Stambaugh, Rick Sechrist and Irvin Rappoldt.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The November treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

Mahlon Stambaugh gave the S.E.O. report for the past month. He did a perk test for Dwight Bortner at the Glenville Inn. Mr. Bortner will need to put in holding tanks. Mr. Stambaugh has completed the work for the Hoke's Mill property. He has been in touch with Curtis Saunders of Glenville where it was found that sewage is running into the stream. Mr. Saunders will need time to correct this problem. Mr. Stambaugh told him he will have the same time frame as Mr. Bortner to correct the problem.

Chairman Glatfelter told Mr. Stambaugh that the Board had made a decision to hire S E O Services, Inc. (William A. Deal, SEO) as sewage enforcement officer for 1994. Mr. Glatfelter thanked Mr. Stambaugh for the many years of work he has done for the Township. Mr. Stambaugh was asked to bring a list of all work he is due from the Township and to also turn over all Township records, which will be needed by the new S.E.O.

Mr. Stambaugh reported that he has not signed Form B for the Munshower subdivision since he cannot find a suitable spot for an alternate system should the present one malfunction.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to adopt the 1994 Budget as prepared and advertised for public inspection. James Bailey seconded this motion. This motion carried.

James Bailey made a motion to appoint George Williams to another 3-year term to the Zoning Hearing Board, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried. Mr. Williams new term will run from January 1, 1994 to December 31, 1996.

Solicitor Herrold reported that District Magistrate Klinedinst had entered a judgment in the amount of \$559.72 against Lamar Wolfgang. If this judgment is not paid, his property could be levied against. If the violation is not corrected, he could be charged again by the Zoning Officer filing charges.

The Board discussed the complaints from some residents regarding the shooting at the Jefferson Sportsmans Club. Farmers working in the fields are at danger from the shots and would like for something to be done to stop this danger. The Board will look into this matter and make a decision as to what can be done.

Irvin Rappoldt reported that he has checked on the recreational vehicle at the Elbert Hines property along Chadwick Court. He talked to a son, who would not comment, and is waiting to hear from the owner, Mr. Hines. When Irvin visited the property, he did find a travel trailer on the property, but did not see any evidence of any discharge from the trailer.

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Irvin would like to get approval for the subdivision plan of his property along Fissel Church Road as soon as possible. He is separating the existing house from the the balance of the unimproved land. If the Planning Commission approves Form B for sending to D.E.R. at the December 9 meeting the secretary was authorized to sign the form.

Charles Wehrly reported that he had talked to Supervisor Tom Wolfe of Springfield Township regarding the repairs to Bridge #321 at Springfield Lane. Springfield Township wants to do the scouring job which would be a joint project with Codorus Township. The cost has been estimated at approximately \$29,000.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to go along with Springfield Township in the above repairs to Bridge #321, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

Charles Wehrly reported that he had been asked by Mr. Kepler, an employee of Jefferson Borough, asking if the Township would be interested in using the Township mowing equipment to mow from Highland Ave. to Burns Road in the Borough, and if so, what would the Township charge the Borough. Mr. Wehrly estimates that this would involve 2 or 3 hours use of the mower and operator.

James Bailey made a motion that the Township use the mowing equipment to mow two or three hours for Jefferson Borough at \$50.00 per hour for equipment and operator. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. This motion carried.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M. on motion by James Bailey and second by Lamar Glatfelter.
