The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on July 1, 1993 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Mr. & Mrs. Rick Sechrist, Billy Bare and Timothy Bare. Donald Bollinger joined the meeting later. Maria Elmiger was also present.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

Timothy Bare was present with the Wallace Cheek subdivision plan that had been approved February 12, 1986, but had never been recorded, due to Attorney Donald Albright's oversight. Mr. Bare is re-financing and needs to have the plan recorded to obtain a new mortgage.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to re-approve the Wallace Cheek plan, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried and the plan was signed.

Mrs. Robert Elmiger was present with their plan. The copies of the plan need to be notarized and the 'Warning' statement must be legible on all copies. She will have these items taken care of by the July 14th meeting. The sewage module has been approved by the Department of Environmental Resources.

James Bailey made a motion that the Chairman sign the service agreement from Waste Management for the temporary recycling dumpster to be brought in July 22 and removed July 26, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion carried.


