

August 11, 1993

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on August 11, 1993 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Mahlon Stambaugh, Rick & Lisa Sechrist, Frank Mitchell, Lee Irwin, Tom Moore and Ellen O'Connor of the York County Solid Waste Authority.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting to order with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

Solicitor Herrold reported that he has advertised the addition of 660.80 acres proposed for the Agricultural Security Area. He will prepare the Resolution to be adopted at the September 8 meeting.

Under the new ruling regarding public comments, Solicitor Herrold doesn't feel that the Township needs a Resolution regarding this since the Chairman will be able to deal with this.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to issue a road occupancy permit to GTE, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

Ellen O'Connor of the York County Solid Waste Authority was present to comment on the work of the Authority. She reported that a county wide sludge and septage plan is in the draft stage. A leaf and yard waste plan is in place with a mobile unit to take through the county for the mulching and shredding of clippings in case the municipality wishes to develop its own compost site.

Ms. O'Connor reported that the Authority will hold an open house Sunday, September 26 from 1-5 P.M. and that an annual hazard waste collection will be held September 24 at the New Freedom Community Building from 12 Noon to 7 P.M. and at the Blackbridge plant on September 25 from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. She stated that paint and aerosol cans may be put in the regular garbage pickup.

Mahlon Stambaugh reported that Terry Heidler has promised to do something about the sewage problem at his property along Brenneman/Krebs Road.

Mahlon also reported that Margaret Wilhelm has taken care of the problem at her mobile home.

Frank Mitchell was present to discuss the possibility of moving his sand mound septic system which is too close to his house. He was told that to do this, he would need to have another perk test done. Mahlon Stambaugh explained the reason for the sand mound system being at the spot it is. Mr. Mitchell left the meeting, saying he did not wish to have another perk test done.

Lee Irwin was present, asking the Board if the Township would be interested in working with him in removing the bank along the Township road right-of-way at his father's property along Bonnair Road. The Irwins are working with the Chesapeake Bay Program to control water that runs off Ridge Road into their barnyard. When the bank is removed, the Irwins would take care of the seeding and soil erosion. Supervisor Wehrly stated that this work would be of no benefit to the Township, but there may be some help for their project if the road could be relocated to remove the sharp curve at the Irwin property.

The supervisors will meet with Mr. Irwin at the site on Thursday, August 12 at 6 P.M. to discuss any work the Board would be willing to do.

The secretary will advertise another recycling weekend for August 27 thru August 30th.

The Board discussed the purchase of a new backhoe versus having the present one repaired.

All Board members feel that the purchase of a new backhoe for around \$39,000 would not justify the cost due to the amount of work done with a backhoe.

James Bailey made a motion to have Worley Equipment pick up the present backhoe for repairs instead of advertising for bids for a new one. Charles Wehrly seconded this motion. This motion carried.

The Township will use the rented backhoe until the monthly agreement is up on August 19, 1993.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 P.M. on motion by Charles Wehrly and second by James Bailey.
