

October 7, 1993

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Thursday, October 7, 1993 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Tom Moore and Mr. & Mrs. Aldo Dellacoletta.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the board members.

Mr. & Mrs. Aldo Dellacoletta were present regarding the signal light being installed at Pentland & Daron roads. CSXT Railroad is installing the signal with the approval of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. The water line on the property recently purchased by the Dellacolettas was broken by the contractor doing the digging. Mr. Dellacoletta is very upset about the water line which comes from a spring on a property across the road and under the railroad tracks. Although the contractor repaired the water pipe, the Dellacolettas are not satisfied with the repair work since the water line seems to be leaking at different places. Also, an electric pole was placed in the driveway of the newly purchased property. After numerous calls to CSXT and PennDot, the property owners haven't gotten any cooperation from either and wanted to know if the Township could do anything to solve the problems. The railroad company tells Mr. Dellacoletta that the right-of-way for the railroad is 60 ft. and that the water line was installed under the tracks without permission from PSXT, and that the utility pole is on the railroads ROA.

Although the Board sympathizes with the new owners of the property, there is nothing the Township can do about their problems. The property is question waspurchased from Mr. & Mrs. Larry Eddinger.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to hold the fall road inspection on Friday, October 22 at 7:30 A.M., seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

The board discussed the repair work for Bridge #321 (jointly serving both Codorus Township and Springfield Township.) C.S. Davidson has estimated the work to cost approximately \$93,000 for total repairs or approximately \$29,000 for scouring job. Charles Wehrly talked with Tom Wolf, a Springfield Township supervisor regarding this bridge. Both townships would be in favor of abandoning this bridge which is of little use to township residents. The board will consult Solicitor Herrold regarding this before making a commitment to spend so much money on repairs.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to appoint Charles Wehrly as Township representative to the York Area Earned Income Tax Bureau to replace Marilyn Goodson, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

The secretary discussed the proposal by the R.J. Hall Company to organize the pension fund records so everything will be in order for the State Audit of the fund.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to hire the R.J. Hall Company to perform the above service at an annual cost of \$450.00 which will be an expense to the pension plan, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

There were no public comments from the floor.

The secretary reported that a check for \$17,074.08 had been received for the townships share of the foreign fire insurance premium tax. This must be distributed to the relief associations of the fire companies and Tri-Community Ambulance.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to distribute the foreign fire insurance premium tax as follows:

The Glen Rock Firemen's Relief Association	\$ 5,122.22	(30%)
The Jefferson Firemen's Relief Association	5,122.22	(30%)
Seven Valleys Fire Co. Relief Association	3,414.82	(20%)
New Freedom Firemen's Relief Association	1,707.42	(10%)
Tri-Community Ambulance Relief Association	1,707.40	(10%)

James Bailey seconded this motion. The motion carried.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to retain the present tax structure for 1994: 1/2 mill real estate, \$5.00 per capita tax, 1/2 of 1% earned income tax, and 1/2 of 1% real estate tax transfer tax. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. The motion carried.

The bills were presented to the board. James Bailey made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M. on motion by Lamar Glatfelter and second by Charles Wehrly.
