

November 10, 1993

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, November 10, 1993 at 7:30 P. M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Charles Wehrly. Others present were: Solicitor Herrold, Mahlon Stambaugh, Rick Sechrist, Debi Munshower, Dwight Bortner and Steve Webster.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes stand approved as written.

Mahlon Stambaugh, S.E.O., reported that he had made a dye test at the Glenville Inn and also at the Curtis Saunders property. The test was positive for both properties. The septage is going into the nearby stream.

Dwight Bortner, owner of the Glenville Inn. was present and asked why everyone with malfunctioning systems in the Village of Glenville is not being sent letters of violation. He feels he is being singled out. When he bought the property he was unaware of any problems with the septic system and never knew that septage was going into the stream. Chairman Glatfelter told Mr. Bortner that the Township wants this problem corrected and will give him ample time to do what ever is required to meet D.E.R. regulations. S.E.O. Mahlon Stambaugh stated that if the Game/Fish Commission knew of this problem, Mr. Bortner and others whose sewage is going into the stream would have to pay stiff fines.

Mr. Bortner stated he was not in a financial position at present to do major repairs to his system.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion that Mr. Bortner be given 60 days to have a perk test done to determine what will be needed to correct the violation. After the 60 days, Mr. Bortner will return to discuss what needs to be done and be given adequate time to complete the work. James Bailey seconded this motion. The motion carried.

Mahlon Stambaugh is to give Mr. Saunders the same terms for correcting the problem at his property.

Chairman Glatfelter told Mahlon Stambaugh that the Board is checking out another S.E.O. due to the many complaints regarding the problems people have reaching him and having their calls returned. A decision will be made later regarding this.

Steve Webster is rebuilding the old hotel property at Brodbeck's and is checking out a site for the septic system. He wants to see if George Tracey would allow him to use some of his property for the system. He will check this out and report back. He plans 2 units in the building, plus a couple of offices, if allowed.

James Bailey made a motion to purchase a Canon Fax machine from Wicke's of New Oxford, seconded by Charles Wehrly. This motion carried.

Charles Wehrly made a motion to budget \$11,499.41 for the 1994 pension payment, seconded by James Bailey. This motion passed.


The secretary announced that the York County Convention for Townships of the Second Class will be held at Dover Fire Hall on January 8, 1994.
