

February 6, 1997

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on February 6, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township building. Board members present were Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were Timothy Steger, Mark Kuhn of Groff Tractor and John Kovach, York Daily Record.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting to order with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

Sealed bids for a backhoe were opened and read as advertised. Two bids were received.

Groff Tractor & Equipment of Mechanicsburg bid \$53,750.00 for a Case 580-L with \$2,800.00 trade-in on the John Deere hoe, for a net cost of \$50,950.00. This backhoe meets all specifications except the universal joint is not permanently lubricated.

Messick Equipment of Abbottstown, PA bid \$42,700.00 on a Model 555-D Ford New Holland Tractor Loader Backhoe with an allowance of \$14,000.00 on the trade-in for the John Deere Backhoe for a net bid price of \$28,700.00. All specifications were met.

James Bailey made a motion to award the backhoe bid to Messick Equipment Co., seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

A letter was read from David W. Sherrer, Elementary Supervisor, Southern York Co. School District. Mr. Sherrer is asking for the Township's support in funding the cost of the D.A.R.E. program for the fifth grade classes. He estimates the first year cost to the school district to be \$6,600.00 and feels that each municipality in the district pay according to the percentage of fifth grade students in the municipality. Codorus Township has 41 students or 16.5% of the total. Codorus Township's share has been assessed at \$1,089.00 for the first year.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion that Codorus Township send the Southern York County School District \$1,089.00 to use for the D.A.R.E. program. James Bailey seconded this motion. This motion carried.

Tim Steger gave the roadmaster report for the past month. He reported that the storm water problem on Smith & Myers Roads is still unsolved. He has talked with Joe Polignone but no solution has been reached. Tim believes that a pipe across Myers Road might solve the problem by taking the water into the wooded area.

Goldie Day will have Kent Bitting of the York County Conservation District check this problem and make recommendations as to what can be done to solve the problem.

The Board discussed road projects for 1997. It was decided to blacktop the unpaved section of Roser Road for about 1/4 mile and Glatfelter Road from Buffalo Valley Road to the private land of Lou Vecchioni, another 1/4 mile. This work will be paid from the General Fund.

There were no public comments.

The bills were presented to the Board for payment.

James Bailey made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M. on motion by Goldie Day and seconded by James Bailey.
