

March 6, 1997

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Thursday, March 6, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were: Timothy Steger, Brian Baer and John Kovach.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

Timothy Steger, the Roadmaster, gave his report for the month. He reported that he has most of the deeds of release & quit claims signed by the Roser Road residents for the road to be improved this summer. He also reported that he had Harry Brose of Roadite down to estimate the cost of FB Modified and Motor paving for Roser and Glatfelter roads.

For Roser Road, FB Modified would cost approximately \$21,600.00 and for ID-2 Wearing the cost would be approximately \$38,213; for Glatfelter Road the cost for FB-Modified is estimated at \$17,136 and for ID-2 \$25,558.00.

Although the FB Modified is cheaper, the Board was not pleased with the FB Modified placed on Miller Road in 1996, the Board voted to have these two sections motor paved. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to bid for motor paving on Roser and Glatfelter Roads, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

Tim also reported that he has spoken to Joe Polignone and told him that he must do something about the storm water problem at his property.

Lamar Glatfelter stated that William McGrew asked for "Children at Play" signs to be placed on Tannery Road in the area of the F.D. Miller home and shop. Tim was asked to take care of this.

A Stone Church member had complained to Lamar about the traffic traveling too fast past the church on Sundays when parishioners are backing or pulling out from parking spaces. Tim will put "SLOW" sign at the Pedestrian sign.


The 1996 Bridge inspection reports were reviewed by the Supervisors and roadmaster.

The bills were presented to the Board. James Bailey made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.
