

August 13, 1997

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, August 13, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Office. Board members present were Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Brian Baer, Marsha McKnight, Paul Hoffman, Rick Sechrist, Tim Steger and John Kovach.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

Solicitor Herrold went over the specifications for bidding for garbage collection. The Board decided that the estimated number of households to use in the bid specs should be 600.

James Bailey made a motion that Solicitor Herrold advertise the bid proposals for bid opening at the September 10<sup>th</sup> meeting at 7:30 P.M. Goldie Day seconded this motion. This motion carried.

The solicitor has asked Gilbert Malone, Solicitor for the Planning Commission to discuss and review the Recreation Plan with the Planning Commission before any action is taken by the Board of Supervisors.

Rene F. deBrabander has made an application to have his farm of 151 acres added to the Agricultural Security Area. Solicitor Herrold will prepare the Resolution for adding this farm to the existing Agricultural Security Area. This application has been before the Township Planning Commission and approved by the Planners for adding to the Security Area.

Paul Hoffman, a resident living at the corner of Shaffers Church Road and Parrish Road asked about the Township making Parrish Road a hard road. Traffic using Parrish Road throws stones all over his lawn and garden and the dust is very, very bad. He was told that the Board has not considered paving Parrish Road since some of the residents along the road have stated that they will not sign the release.

Chairman Glatfelter told Mr. Hoffman that the Board is looking into something to keep the dust down. Roadmaster Tim Steger has learned that Carroll County, Maryland is using wet calcium for dust. The Township will look into this.

Mr. Hoffman also said he is concerned about the forsythia bushes on the Busch property. These bushes are growing out on the road. Chairman Glatfelter told Mr. Hoffman that there is not a whole lot the Board can do about this.

A letter was read from the Manheim Township Supervisors, requesting a meeting with the Codorus Township Board of Supervisors regarding the replacement of the joint bridge on Pentland Road. This meeting will be arranged.

Tim Steger reported that Roadite was down to do the boring on Roser Road. Roadite says that the

road was not graded correctly by the Township before the paving . Tim feels that the grading was done in compliance with the Contractors, York Building and Roadite.



Lamar Glatfelter talked about doing something regarding the outdoor stoves/incinerator pollution problem. Property owners living near these stoves are experiencing problems with breathing.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 P.M. on motion by Lamar Glatfelter and seconded by Goldie Day.
