

January 6, 1997

After the close of the 1997 Organizational meeting the Board of Supervisors convened for the regular portion of the meeting. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were Marty Heyne and Charles Wheat.

Marty Heyne of Heyne's Refuse Service had questions and concerns regarding the Township's proposal to bid for garbage collection. Mr. Heyne stated that their company serves the majority of Codorus Township, and over the past twenty-five years have had few complaints about their service. His company cannot compete with large haulers like York Waste Disposal and Waste Management.

Mr. Heyne stated that their rates are \$51.75 per quarter for up to six 33-gallon bags, \$41.25 per quarter for retired persons for up to four 33-gallonbags and \$2.65 per bag for those generating little trash.

Mr. Heyne will attend the meeting to be held January 15 to state his position regarding the Township's proposal to put trash pick-up out for bids. The Heyne company is too small to bid on an exclusive contract.

Charles Wheat was present with questions about the proposal to bid for trash pick-up. His concern was mainly regarding when the bids would be finalized.

The Board told Mr.Wheat that it will be several months before the bid opening takes place.

James Bailey made a motion to approve the Actual Use Report for 1997 for sending to Penn Dot, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried and the report was signed.

Goldie Day made a motion to authorize the Chairman to sign the Survey of Financial Conditions, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to issue renewal junk yard licenses to Ed Lucke and Virginia Snyder, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

Chairman Glatfelter reported that he has had many complaints regarding the York County Rail Trail activities. Especially, the dinner train is causing a nuisance to residents living near the trail. The dinner train stopped in Larue on New Year's Eve with loud and boisterous passengers getting off the train around midnight or later, causing neighbors to complain. Lamar will talk with Tom Shelley for information on whose responsibility it is to regulate the trail activities.

There were no public comments.

James Bailey made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M. on motion by Goldie Day and second by James Bailey.
