

February 12, 1997

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on February 12, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Building. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were: Solicitor John Herrold, Irvin Rappoldt, Charles Wheat, Timothy Steger and Teresa Crone, York Dispatch Correspondent.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

Solicitor Herrold explained the proposed trash collection ordinance that had been legally advertised for adoption. Resident Charles Wheat had some questions on the ordinance. He was told that this ordinance gives the Board the authority to bid for trash pickup. This will be a non-mandatory service, but if the bid is awarded, the hauler getting the bid would be the only hauler residents could use. Residents not using this hauler could dispose of their trash by some other means. They could not use another hauler.

The Board will decide later on bidding for curbside recycling.

James Bailey made a motion to adopt Ordinance #97-1, the trash ordinance, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried and the ordinance was signed by the Chairman.

The Board sought Solicitor Herrold's advice on getting rid of the buildings on the property being bought for recreation purposes. The barn and large brick house will be demolished and all the debris taken away. One person has already expressed an interest in taking away the buildings and removing all the debris. Solicitor Herrold stated that he thought the fairest way to proceed would be to advertise for interested parties to submit a proposal. The Board could put conditions on the removal of the buildings and cleanup and should require a refundable \$5,000.00 bond from the person getting the job. The bond would be forfeited if the work was not satisfactory.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the report of building permits issued during the month of January. He also reported that David Smith of Hill Climb Road has asked for more time to remove the junked cars from his property. Lamar Glatfelter asked Irvin to check a property along SR. 616 for a junked car violation.

The York Area Earned Income Tax Bureau is working with the York Bank on the electronic transfer of tax payments to the Township's bank and asked that the Township sign a Resolution authorizing this electronic transfer of Earned Income Tax payments to the Glen Rock State Bank.

Goldie Day made a motion to adopt the resolution and sign the ACH Origination

Agreement requested by the York Bank. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. This motion carried.

Solicitor Herrold reported that some Township Ordinances will have to be changed back to criminal instead of civil for enforcement purposes. This is necessary since the Township Code has been changed.


Timothy Steger reported that he had met with Ken Bitting of the York County Conservation District and inspected the storm water problem on Smith Road. Mr. Bitting wants to take another look at the problem when the ground is not snow covered. He feels this is not an erosion problem, but a storm water one. On his next visit, he will make some suggestions on how to deal with the problem.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.

The Roadmaster went over some rules he is working on for the hourly employees. He will add more rules to the list. The Board felt these rules were satisfactory for a start.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M. on motion by James Bailey and seconded by Lamar Glatfelter.
