The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on May 1, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey and Goldie Day. Others present were: Beth Lucabaugh, Tim Bare, John Kovach, April Rehbein, Tim Steger and Charles Wheat.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge. The minutes were approved as written.

Charles Wheat asked if the newspaper article was true that the Township is now considering joining the Southern York County Regional Recreation Commission. Chairman Glatfelter told him this was not true.

Beth Lucabaugh asked if the Township would need their own police protection if a recreational area is approved. She also wanted to know if the Township would be re-zoned to allow for development around a recreation area. She was told the answer to both questions is "No".

Timothy Steger gave the roadmaster report for the month of April. He reported that 'Slow' signs have been placed on Stone Church Road and 'Children at Play' signs on Tannery Road. He has talked with Joe Polignone. Joe is trying to do something about the water problem at his place. Smith Road has been raised on one side. New road work is going well.

James Bailey made a motion to have Louis Vecchioni replace the metal on the small Township building at a cost of \$6,900.00. Goldie Day seconded this motion. The motion carried.


