

September 4, 1997

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Thursday, September 4, 1997 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, James Bailey, and Goldie Day. Others present were Lt. Gerald Smith of the Pa. State Police Barracks in Loganville, Marie Walter, Marsha McKnight, Timothy Steger, Charles Wheat, Deborah Slawson and John Kovach.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The treasurers's report was presented to the Board.

Lt. Smith of the State Police Barracks gave a very informative talk on the work of the local barracks. He sated that there have been no major problems in Codorus Township; that crime is down; enforcement is up with the addition of 14 troopers at the Loganville barracks.

Lt. Smith answered some questions from those present. When resident Charles Wheat asked him about speeding trucks on S.R. 216 in the Friendship School area, he reported that radar has been stepped up, troopers are on the roads all the time since their shifts are staggered.

Marsha McKnight told Lt. Smith that she has a concern with the large trucks speeding on Hill Climb Rd. which has a 35-mile speed limit.

Marie Walter had some questions regarding follow-up reports to burglar victims regarding stolen firearms.

Chairman Glatfelter asked what the Board can do regarding the dumping of tires along Township roads. Positive identification is necessary to prosecute. Someone from the Township is to call Lt. Smith on September 5, with any information available on the identity of the persons dumping tires.

Tim Steger reported that he had a request from the Woods family along S.R. 216, just east of Friendship School asking for the erection of "Children at Play" signs. The secretary will contact Penn Dot to get the Department's permission for these signs.

Tim also reported that he spoke with Barry Sweitzer of Springfield Township about using a calcium mix to keep dust down on dirt roads. Tim will keep in touch with Barry in an effort to find a supplier for the calcium.

Chairman Glatfelter asked Tim to check the bushes at the Ann Bathon farm and also at the Susan Franklin property for bushes causing a problem with site distances.

James Bailey made a motion to pay the registration fee of \$170.00 for Deborah Slawson to attend the PA Planning Association workshops on October 6 & 7<sup>th</sup> at State College. Goldie Day seconded this motion. This motion carried.


The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by James Bailey. This motion carried.
