

November 11, 1998

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on November 11, 1998 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Brian Baer and Goldie Day. Others present were Solicitor John Herrold, Marsha McKnight, Irvin Rappoldt, Charles Wheat, Buck Buchanan and Robert Finke.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

A public comment period was held before taking action on the Southern Police Agreement and Codorus Township.

Marsha McKnight had some questions of Mr. Buchanan, a representative from the Southern Police Department.

Solicitor Herrold explained the agreement. According to the Agreement, the Southern York County School District is contracting police services from the Southern Regional Police Department. Since Friendship School is in Codorus Township, this contract with the Township is necessary in order to give the Police Department authorization to enter Codorus Township (Friendship School) to carry out duties outlined in the contract between the School District and the Southern Regional Police Department.

The Township will not be liable for costs associated with this agreement. Also, the Southern Regional Police Department must maintain in full force a liability insurance policy with a minimum one million dollar limit with Codorus Township as named insured.

Mr. Buchanan, Shrewsbury Borough council member, explained how the police patrols for the School District will be handled. There will be some set times for patrolling the schools and also some random patrols.

Brian Baer made a motion to accept and sign the Southern Police Agreement, seconded by Goldie Day. This motion carried.

Mr. Buchanan will have the Agreement witnessed and return two copies to Solicitor Herrold.

Mr. Buchanan also stated that the D.A.R.E. program has started in the schools. A grant has been received for the initial cost of this program. When the grant money is used up, Codorus Township will be called on for some financial support.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the report of building permits issued in October.

He also stated that Cleveland Thompson has cleaned up some, but has much more to do.

The bills were presented to the Board.


Brian Baer made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.
