

October 7, 1999

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on October 7, 1999 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Brian Baer and Goldie Day. Others present were Timothy Steger, Kelly Mills, Irvin Rappoldt, Randy Sterner, Charles Wheat, John Heltzel, Robert Finke and John Kovach.

Chairman Glatfelter opened the meeting with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written. The Treasurer's report was presented to the Board members.

Under public comments, resident Charles Wheat had some questions regarding the SPCA agreement with the Township. He was told that Solicitor Herrold is reviewing this agreement and the Board will take action at the October 13th meeting.

Kelly Mills gave the report of taxes collected during the month of September.

The Mary Gardner Planning Module was approved for submission to DEP by motion made by Lamar Glatfelter and seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried. Vote 3-0. This subdivision had been previously approved for Reba Berkheimer. Ms. Gardner's lot had never been perc tested until recently.

Tim Steger gave the roadmaster report. He reported that the guard rail at the new Pentland Road bridge has been installed. All that is needed to finish the job is line painting. The new truck is at Lancaster Truck Body for the dump bed to be built.

Brian Baer made a motion to issue two road occupancy permits to GTE for work on Fiscal and Zeigler roads. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to set Trick or Treat night for Saturday, October 30th from 6 P.M. to 8 P.M., seconded by Goldie Day. This motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The secretary reported that Supervisor Guy Brown of Heidelberg Township had stopped in with a letter of intent. Seven local municipalities are interested in having a regional police commission study done. The municipalities are asking Codorus to join in the study which will be done at no charge to the Township. Grant monies are available to pay for the study.

Chairman Glatfelter stated he would like to see what the study would show. The secretary will try to find out more information on the joint proposal.

The secretary reported that four quotations have been received for de-icing salt. The quotations are:

1. Oceanport Industries quoted \$34.12 per ton
2. International Salt quoted \$34.60 per ton
3. Rochez Bros., Inc. quoted \$38.96 per ton

4. Cargill Salt quoted \$38.00 per ton

Goldie Day made a motion to accept the quote of Oceanport Industries, the low quoted price of \$34.12 per ton, delivered to the Township. Brian Baer seconded this motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The secretary has received proof from Timothy & Deborah Cartmell that the 1998 County & Township real estate taxes were paid at settlement on April 30, 1998. The Cartmell's are due \$500.74 for a duplicate payment on the 1998 taxes.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to refund \$500.74 to the Cartmells, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried. Vote 3-0.


Irvin Rappoldt reported that five building permits were issued during September. He also checked on the Myers property along Catholic Valley Road. There are three mobile homes on the property. This number is allowed. Also Irvin stated that he has not talked to Tom Divan about removing the block fence at his property.

Kelly asked that the Board adopt an ordinance that would permit her to charge \$2.00 or \$3.00 per duplicate tax bill that she is asked to provide. Most of these duplicates are requested by Tax Services. The Board will find out what other municipalities are doing before adopting an ordinance. Without an ordinance, the tax collector cannot legally charge for this service.

The bills were presented to the Board. Brian Baer made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The meeting adjourned at 9:10 P.M. on motion by the chairman and seconded by Brian Baer.
