

September 8, 1999

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on September 8, 1999 at 7:30 in the Township Building. Board members present were Lamar Glatfelter, Brian Baer and Goldie Day. Others present were Solicitor John Herrold, Irvin Rappoldt, Charles Wheat, Wayne Lehr and Robert Finke.

Chairman Glatfelter called the meeting to order with the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as written.

There were no public comments.

Irvin Rappoldt gave the report of building permits issued during the month of August. A total of nine permits were issued.

He also talked to Tom Divan about the block fence/wall which is two rows of 8" blocks 52" high. Lamar Glatfelter said he feels the fence should come down.

Irvin also checked the Billy Davis property. No one is living in the small building. He issued a permit for the storage shed that is under construction.

Irvin had issued a permit to Kenneth & Donald Myers for a mobile home on property along Catholic Valley Road. Irvin was asked to check the number of dwellings on this parcel.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion that Irvin ask Tom Divan to remove the 52" high block fence on his property seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried. Vote 3-0. He would not be required to remove the slab.

An extension on the Graystone Development project has been granted to November 30th in order to give the Township extra time to complete outstanding items an DEP Approval.

Goldie Day made a motion to accept the Graystone Development extension to November 30, 1999, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The Board discussed the SPCA Agreement with Solicitor Herrold. Some additional information is needed before the Board votes to accept the Agreement. The SPCA is asking the Township to pay \$15.00 for each stray animal brought to the shelter from Codorus Township plus additional fees for injured animals.

A decision on this agreement will be made later.

An agreement from York County Planning Commission was received today, setting forth the house numbering services the County would provide for \$16,500.00. Since this agreement was received

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today, the Board needs some time before making a decision.

The bills were presented to the Board . Brian Baer made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 P.M. on motion by Lamar Glatfelter and seconded by Brian Baer.
