

June 5, 2003

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on June 5, 2003 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were Brian Baer, Lamar Glatfelter and Goldie Day. Others present were Cecile Fetters, Charles Wheat, Irvin Rappoldt, Marlette Thomas, John Kovach, Franklin Barrick, Mr. & Mrs. Frank Barrick and April Rehbein.

Chairman Baer called the meeting to order.

The minutes of May 14<sup>th</sup> were approved with two corrections. (1) The roadmaster was not told to go ahead with the work at the Byers property at the end of Shaffers Church Rd., but to discuss the problem further and (2) 400 ft. of pipe would be needed for the Keiser dry hydrant, not 240 ft.

The treasurer's report was presented to the Board members.

There were no public comments.

Irvin Rappoldt said the man living in the mobile home at the Lippi property on Meckley Road has moved out. The property is empty. At the Buckley property on Nafe Sawmill Rd. the mother is living over the garage. No permit was issued. Gerald Kile Jr. has a cleaning business he runs out of the building at the end of Rockville Rd. He plans on building a home on the property later.

Bids were opened as advertised for the furnishing and placing of ID-2 Binder and ID-2 Wearing for Sunny Slope Rd.

Two bids were received for furnishing ID-2 Binder and ID-2 Wearing:

York Building Products, Inc. bid \$25.35 per ton for furnishing 900 Tons ID-2 Binder, total \$22,815. and \$28.95 per ton for furnishing 700 Tons ID-2 Wearing, Total \$20,265.

Bituminous Paving bid \$27.85 per ton for furnishing 900 Tons ID-2 Binder, total \$25,065. and \$30.55 per ton for furnishing 700 tons ID-2 Wearing, total \$21,385.

Four bids were received for placing 900 tons ID-2 Binder and 700 Tons ID-2 Wearing.

Robert Kinsley bid \$7.50 per ton for placing the binder, total \$6,750. and \$7.75 for placing the wearing, total \$5,425.

Long's Asphalt bid \$5.80 per ton for placing the binder, total \$5,220. and \$5.80 per ton for placing the wearing, total \$4,060.

Emory Peters bid \$7.50 per ton for placing the binder, total \$6,750. and \$7.50 per ton for placing the wearing, total \$5,250.

Fitz & Smith bid \$7.15 per ton for placing the binder, total \$6,435. and \$7.85 per ton for placing the wearing, total \$5,495.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to award the bid for furnishing 900 tons ID-2 binder and 700 tons ID-2 wearing to York Building Products, Inc., the low bidder, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried.

On motion by Brian Baer and seconded by Goldie Day the Board will postpone awarding the placing of the ID-2 binder and ID-2 wearing until the next meeting on June 11<sup>th</sup>. This will give the roadmaster time to check on references for Long's Asphalt.

Goldie Day made a motion to approve the Sewage Facilities Planning Module for Ken Holcomb and George Weisenborn for sending to DEP. Lamar Glatfelter seconded this motion. The motion carried.

Dennis Weichert informed Brian Baer that he doesn't wish to serve another term on the Recreation Board. The Township will look for someone else to be appointed to this position.

Marlette Thomas gave the roadmaster report for the past month. The letters sent to Ross Paving and Harman Builders have brought no response. This will be taken up with Solicitor Herrold on the 11<sup>th</sup>. The pipe ordered for the dry hydrant at Earl Keisers has been ordered and is to be delivered this week. Mowing is being done. Recon was down and did bores on Shaffers Church Road. No report from them yet.

Phoebe Larues son was in regarding the problem at her place and the Byers property. He is not too happy that nothing is being done to correct the water problem at Mrs. Larue's home. There is too much stuff in the bottom of the pipe. Need to dig on the other side to find the pipe and have it flushed out. Then a new culvert box could be installed on left side going down and have the fire company come out to flush the pipe out. A two-foot diameter pipe with a hole in the bottom of the culvert box. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion that this work be done, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried.

Marlette also said the North Codorus Township roadmaster had called about Codorus Township helping them out on a project with a dump truck and man. North Codorus would in turn help Codorus. Marlette was told to do what he thinks is right. Marlette was to go ahead and buy a chain saw and weed eater. These two items are needed.

Franklin Barrick and his son Franklin and his wife were at the meeting regarding the building lot the younger Barrick sold. The buyer has built a house and the ruts are getting deeper and deeper in the lane to the house. The new owner has taken the breakers out and turned the water on Franklin Sr. The new owner doesn't want to deal with the problem. Supervisor Glatfelter told the Barricks that this is not a Township problem

since it involves personal property. He should first call the York County Conservation District so they can check for violations.


