

August 7, 2003

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on August 7, 2003 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Building. Board members present were: Brian Baer, Lamar Glatfelter and Goldie Day. Others present were Charles Wheat, Marlette Thomas, Marjorie Shaxted and Nelson Brenneman.

Chairman Baer opened the meeting with the Pledge. The minutes were approved as written. The treasurer's report was presented to the Board.

There were no public comments at this time.

Marjorie Shaxted of 2992 Pentland Road had some concerns she wanted to bring before the Board. She first stated she had a request to make regarding motorists at the Daron & Pentland Road intersection. People drive off the road, not knowing that the road ends. She feels that reflectors placed on the sides of Daron Road could warn people that the road ends. Marlette thinks that a stop sign may help to eliminate this problem. Mrs. Shaxted says some of the people don't seem to know where they are going and get off the road and have to get help in getting their vehicles back on the road.

She also stated that big trucks using Pentland Road day and night are not doing the road any good. There is a lot of noise from these trucks. What can the Township do about this? Lamar Glatfelter agreed to talk to James Bailey about these trucks to see if something can be done regarding the noise.

Also Mrs. Shaxted stated that they are being harassed by realtors stopping at the property, wanting to know if it is for sale. She was told the Board couldn't do anything about this.

Nelson Brenneman wanted to know if the State Police ever patrol Panther Hill and Heindel Roads. Beer bottles, cans and other debris are strewn on the roads. He was told to call the State Police himself when he knows of persons using these roads for drinking, parking, etc.

Nelson also wanted to know if anything could be done to eliminate water at his property on Blackberry Lane. Water comes down and floods the basement on his farm. Marlette will meet with Nelson and take a look at this problem to see what, if anything can be done to prevent this problem.

Marlette Thomas gave the roadmaster report for the past month. He first thanked the Board and everyone for the kindness and concern shown to him and his family following the tragic death of his son and his son's family.

He reported that the dry hydrant at the Earl Keiser property, Rockville Rd. has been installed and the pond is filling up with water. He was told to go ahead and take two loads of stone as requested by Mr. Keiser for the hydrant area.

Marlette reported that the blacktop from the driveway on Snyder Mill Road has not been removed.

Wayne from Recon was down and checked Shaffers Church Road. His suggestion is that we try to live with the problem and sometime later mill it. If we take some of the top off now it will only weaken the road. The Township will see what can be done to cover the yellow lines that are off center.

Marlette said the bearing is going out of the grader. He has talked to the mechanic at Furnival. He thinks they can fix the bearing, injection pump and transmission for \$10,000-12,000. Furnival would haul the grader to and from their shop.

Brian Baer made a motion to go ahead and get the grader fixed, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

Marlette also said something is wrong with the brakes on the Ford pickup. He was instructed to take the truck to Marley Gross Ford to find out what is wrong with it.

Sunny Slope Road is finished except for some shoulder work.

The Board will use State Liquid Fuels monies in 2004 to improve Pentland Road. This will be a costly job, since the road is in such bad shape.

The tax collector report was examined by the Board. Lisa Mansperger is asking that she be exonerated for eighty-five per capita bills for 2003. All these exonerations are for persons that have moved from the Township or have been deleted by the County. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to exonerate the tax collector for eighty-five 2003 per capita taxes, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried.

Goldie Day made a motion to send a letter to Loren Riebling, Manager for Manheim Township, telling him to proceed with drafting the preliminary legal documents for the regional building code program, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

The secretary had three quotations for line painting the hard roads:

1. Alpha Space quoted 170,000 lineal ft. @ \$0.0285 per lineal ft. \$4,845.00
2. Ross Industries quoted 170,000 lineal ft. @ \$0.0275 per lineal ft. \$4,675.00
3. D.E. Gemmill quoted 170,000 lineal ft. @ \$0.058 per lineal ft. \$9,860.00

Goldie Day made a motion to accept the quotation of Ross Industries (the low bidder), for the line painting, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. This motion carried.

The office had three uniform companies in to quote on the uniforms for the road employees. The employees are not too happy with the service by Aramark.

Out of the three quotes on uniforms, Image First out of Lancaster has the best prices. The sales person quoted \$7.68 per week per employee. This would be a \$10.00 plus per week savings for the four employees.


Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to change uniform service from Aarmark to Image First, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried.

The secretary was instructed to send another letter to Todd Foreman, asking him to finish the cleanup job at his property in Neimans. He had the grass cut, but still has tree branches lying around on the property.

The bills were presented to the Board. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Brian Baer. This motion carried.
