

December 8, 2004

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on December 8, 2004. Members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Irvin Rappoldt, and Goldie Day. Others present were: April Rehbein, Cecile Feters, Virginia Craley, Virginia Parker, Tom Moore, Richard Masimore, Bill Fogle, Attorney John Herrold and Jeff Shue.

The meeting was called to order with the pledge to the flag.

The minutes were approved as written.

Virginia Parker was present with the land development plan for a horse arena. Goldie Day made a motion to approve and sign this plan seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Lamar Glatfelter had questions for Attorney Herrold concerning insurance coverage for non-working Supervisors. According to Township codes the Township is allowed to provide coverage of Health Insurance and Life Insurance for non-working Supervisors and their dependents. Attorney Herrold will put something in writing that as effective January 1, 2006 the Township will no longer pay for insurance coverage for non-working Supervisors.

Lamar had some corrections that he wanted made to the draft of the Employee handbook prepared by Attorney Schaumann. Attorney Herrold will forward the corrections to Attorney Schaumann.

Cecile Feters had questions for Attorney Herrold regarding the notice of violation issued to the Graystone WWTP from DEP. Cecile also stated that the Development agreement has been violated. The plans do not match the development agreement. Attorney Herrold said we should wait until after the Zoning Hearing and also wait to hear from DEP.

Bill Fogle gave the Zoning Officer report. Bill is continuing to renew the Hardship permits. Cleveland Thompson is continuing work on his building. He does need to do a seepage pit.

Jeff Shue said he received the results of a traffic study which was conducted on Shaffers Church Road to try and eliminate truck traffic. The study showed that the Township could post signs that no vehicles with a registered gross weight in excess of 9,000 lbs can use the road. Four signs would need to be posted. The road could still be used for local deliveries and emergency vehicles. After some discussion it was decided that no action would be taken.

Irvin Rappoldt made a motion to adopt the budget for 2005 seconded by Goldie. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Lamar spoke to Bill Clifton; he is with one of the conservation districts in York about the water run off problem at the corner of S.R. 516 and Glen Echo Rd. He was told there is a program that will pay 75% and the owner pays 25% to correct the problem. There is also a grassland swall program that pays 100% with the property owner's consent. Lamar will continue looking into this problem.

The bills were presented to the Board. Irvin Rappoldt made a motion to ay the bills seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. The motion carried.
