

May 5, 2005

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on May 5, 2005 at 7:30 P.M. Members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Irvin Rappoldt and Goldie Day. Others present were: David Rehbein, Marlette Thomas, Bill Fogle, Allan Case, Cecile Fetters and Deb Blauch of Global Stone.

The minutes were approved as written.

The sealed bids for 40,000 gallons of E-3 Emulsion were opened and read as follows:

Hammaker East bid \$1.123 per gallon for a total of \$44,920.00

Stewart & Tate bid \$1.19 per gallon for a total of \$47,600

Goldie Day made a motion to award the bid to the low bidder Hammaker East, seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The sealed bids for furnishing 1500 tons of ID-2 Binder and 2700 tons of ID-2 Wearing were opened and read as follows:

York Building Products bid \$27.10 per ton for ID-2 Binder and \$30.24 per ton for ID-2 Wearing. The total bid was \$81,648.00.

Kinsley Construction bid \$27.00 per ton for ID-2 Binder and \$31.25 per ton of ID-2 Wearing. The total bid was \$84,375.00.

Irvin Rappoldt made a motion to award the bid to York Building Products the low bidder, seconded by Goldie Day. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The sealed bids for placing 1500 tons of ID-2 Binder and 2700 tons of ID-2 Wearing were opened and read as follows:

Stewart & Tate bid \$4.98 per ton for placing ID-2 Binder and \$9.23 per ton for placing ID-2 Wearing. The total bid was \$24,921.

Kinsley Construction bid \$7.59 per ton for placing ID-2 Binder and \$7.59 per ton for placing ID-2 Wearing. The total bid was \$20,493.00

Longs Asphalt bid \$5.10 per ton for placing ID-2 Binder and \$5.10 per ton for placing ID-2 Wearing. The total bid was \$13,770.00

Central Penn Asphalt's bid was for placing and furnishing together. The bid was rejected since the placing and furnishing were to be bid separately.

Goldie Day made a motion to award the bid to Long's Asphalt the low bidder, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

The sealed bids for furnished crushed stone were opened and read as follows:

\$5.40 per ton for 2,000 tons 2A
\$7.00 per ton for 1,000 tons AASHTO #57
\$7.00 per ton for 1,000 tons AASHTO #1
\$9.95 per ton for 100 tons Rock Lining R4

The total bid was \$35,150.00

Vulcan Materials bid: \$7.00 per ton for 300 tons ¼" anti skid type 2
\$7.45 per ton for 100 tons AASHTO #10
\$7.50 per ton for 800 tons AASHTO #8 (1%)
\$5.33 per ton for 2,000 tons 2A
\$7.10 per ton for 1,000 tons AASHTO #57
\$7.10 per ton for 1,000 tons AASHTO #1
\$9.95 per ton for 100 tons Rock Lining R4

The total bid was \$34,700.00

Goldie Day made a motion to award the bid to Vulcan Materials the low bidder, seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Quotations for applying Calcium Chloride to the dirt roads were read as follows:

Calcium Chloride Sales quoted .899 per gallon.

JMG Enterprises Inc. quoted .75 per gallon.

Recon quoted .73 per gallon.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to award the job to Recon, seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

One quotation was received for painting the roofs of the Township buildings and the barn roof of the Rockville Road property. Gracey Painting Contractor quoted \$9,353.00. Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to have the painting done by Gracey Painting, seconded by Goldie Day. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Virginia Parker presented her subdivision planning module to the Board. Goldie Day made a motion to approve the planning module seconded by Lamar Glatfelter. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Marlette Thomas gave the roadmaster report. Pentland Road has been completed. The new wood chipper is in and will be picked up on May 6th. There is a site distance problem at the corner of Stone Church Rd. and S.R. 516. The leaves are on the trees at the Morgan property making visibility bad. Also the evergreen trees at the Burrier property located at the Corner of Snyder Road and Shaffers Church Road are blocking the site distance when you are pulling out of Snyder Road. The Board will have Bill Fogle speak to these residents and have the trees trimmed.

Bill Fogle gave the Zoning Officer report. Bill spoke to Mr. Owings owner of the Thompson property. Mr. Owings said the cars will be placed in the pole building and the junk is being hauled away.

Lamar Glatfelter brought up the Zoning Hearing Fees. At the last Planning Commission meeting the fees were discussed. Lamar made a motion to raise the fees to \$650.00 seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Allan Case had questions about subdividing his mother's property. He would like to purchase the farm and add it to his farm. He would like to divide the house off and sell it. Allan was told to come to the Planning Commission meeting on May 26th.


