

February 8, 2006

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met in regular session on February 8, 2006 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township office. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Irvin Rappoldt and Robert Gladfelter. Others present were: April Rehbein, David Rehbein, William Fogle, Marlette Thomas, Michelle & Eric Long, Barbara Kerby, Dennis Wagner, Phil Kelly, Cecile Feters and Attorney John Herrold.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Robert Gladfelter made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Bids were opened and read for a 2006 11,500 GVWR 4X4 Crew Cab Chassis truck with a Reading Service Body. The bids were as follows:

1. Carl Beasley Ford bid \$35,400
2. Manheim Chrysler GMC bid \$35,515
3. Winner Ford bids \$37,226

Robert made a motion to award the bid to the low bidder Carl Beasley Ford, seconded by Lamar. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Michelle & Eric Long of 5126 Hillclimb Road were present. Their cat was killed on the road last week. They have called the police on numerous occasions about the speeders on Hillclimb Road. They feel that radar is needed on this road. The speed limit is posted at 30 M.P.H. but, the speed limit is not being enforced. The Supervisors will contact the State Police and recommend that they monitor Hillclimb Road for speeders.

Bill Fogle reported that Nancy Sterner has had her property surveyed. The house that Thomas Gray has built on Steltz Road is 4 ft. from the property line. Bill has issued a violation to Mr. Gray. Bill will need to wait 30 days before filing a complaint with the District Justice. Bill should ask for the maximum fine and ask the District Justice to let him file daily.

Marlette Thomas talked to the Board about road work for this year. It was decided to blacktop Brodbeck Road. Pipe work will be done on Johnson Road and Shaffers Church Road below Rohrbaugh. The 2-6ft. pipes under the road are rusted and caving in.

Lamar Glatfelter made a motion to approve this work for 2006, seconded by Irvin Rappoldt. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Lisa Myers from the Transportation Department of the Southern School district has requested a school bus stop ahead sign for the bus stop at 3739 Jefferson Rd. Marlette looked at this location and feels this is a bad spot for a bus stop. We will check with the state to see if the bus stop is in a safe location.

Marlette presented quotes for a 9ft. Fisher plow. The quotes were as follows:

1. Douglas Equipment \$4114.50
2. Bradco Supply \$4264.50
3. Penn Hazel \$4350.00

Irvin Rappoldt made a motion to purchase the plow from Douglas Equipment. Robert Gladfelter seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Marlette presented quotes for a strobe light for the new truck. The quotes were as follows:

1. Douglas Equipment \$986.14
2. Moul Enterprises \$1189.95

Lamar Gladfelter made a motion to purchase the light from Douglas Equipment. Irvin Rappoldt seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Bill Fogle gave the zoning officer report. Brenda Lucas of 5185 Glen Echo Road was issued a home occupation permit to open a tea room. Bill sent a letter to Mr. Schreiber on Watertank Road about the grade of his new driveway.

Robert Gladfelter made a motion to authorize payment for the Brenneman Road Bridge. Irvin Rappoldt seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.


The final document for the South Branch Act 167 update was reviewed. The Township will be changing the ordinance to comply with the Act 167. All Townships will need to meet these requirements.
