

April 2, 2009

The Codorus Township Board of Supervisors met on April 2, 2009 at 7:30 P.M. Board members present were: Lamar Glatfelter, Brian Kaltreider and Bob Gladfelter. Others present were: April Rehbein, Laverne Wolfgang, Robert Rebert, Robert Rebert II and Bettylou Smith.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Brian made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Bob seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Robert Rebert II approached the Board and asked if they had reviewed the hand out that he gave them at the March meeting. Mr. Rebert stated that the Supervisors were not following the Township Zoning Ordinance by allowing sewer lines in the AG zone. The Board explained a Zoning Hearing was held that would allow the lines in the AG zone.

The bids were opened as follows:

Three bids were received for furnishing 975 tons Superpave asphalt mixture 19.0 mm binder course .3-3 million ESAL and Furnishing 730 tons Superpave asphalt mixture 9.5 mm wearing course .3-3 million ESAL.

York Building Products bid \$51.25 per ton for furnishing superpave binder and \$51.50 per ton for furnishing superpave wearing for a total bid of \$91,943.75.

Bituminous Paving bid \$59.50 per ton for furnishing superpave binder and \$68.75 per ton for furnishing superpave wearing for a total bid of \$108,200.00.

Kinsley Construction bid \$44.50 per ton for furnishing superpave binder and \$48.60 per ton for furnishing superpave wearing for a total bid of \$78,856.50.

Lamar made a motion to award the bid to the low bidder Kinsley Construction. Brian seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Five bids were received for 250 tons of deicing salt.

Cargill Inc. bid \$75.05 per ton. International Salt bid \$86.69 per ton. Eastern Salt bid \$83.95 per ton. Morton Salt did not bid. American Rock Salt Co. bid \$72.02 per ton.

Brian made a motion to award the bid to the low bidder American Rock Salt Co. Lamar seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Five bids were received for crushed stone.

Hammer East LTD bid \$1.877 per gallon for a total bid of \$75,080. Stewart & Tate bid \$1.63 per gallon for a total bid of \$65,200.

Brian made a motion to award the bid to the low bidder, Stewart & Tate. Lamar seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Quotes were received for Calcium Chloride as follows:

JMG quoted .9600 per gallon. Calcium Chloride Sales, Inc. quoted \$1.079 per gallon. Recon Construction Services Inc. quoted 1.08 per gallon.

Bob made a motion to accept the quote of JMG. Brian seconded the motion. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

A renewal license for Fireworks Productions was presented to the Board. Lamar made a motion to issue the renewal, seconded by Brian. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.

Laverne Wolfgang gave the roadmaster report. The roadcrew has been working on Schuman Road installing 2 culvert boxes and pipes. The dirt roads have been graded and some gutter work has been done. Laverne and Bob have been working on the dirt road grant for Young Road and Ridge Road.

A letter was received from Dean & Brenda Winemiller asking for forgiveness of the rollback tax on the property that was conveyed to St. Jacobs Lutheran Church for the purpose of constructing a new church. The Supervisors are willing to forgive the rollback taxes.

The bills were presented to the Board. Bob made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Lamar. The motion carried. Vote 3-0.
